

Commissioner Wester made a motion to accept all the minutes as presented. Commissioner Foster seconded the motion. No discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.



## Item 7: Items for discussion:


- A. Leesa McMillan Leash Law Proposal: Ms. McMillan expressed to the board that the county desperately has a need for a leash law to help with animal and public safety.
- B. Chris Moon, 345 Smith Rd, Lavonia, Ga, has filed an application for an Amendment to the Franklin County Zoning Map from Commercial General (CG) to Agriculture Intensive (AI) on a +/-24.24 acres. The property is located on Pleasant Hill Rd and is further identified as tax parcel 062-127C.

Director DeLozier restated the request to the board, noting that he and the Planning and Zoning Board recommended approval with no added conditions.

Commissioner Foster motioned to approve Mr. Moon's application to rezone from Commercial General (CG) to Agricultural Intensive (AI). Commissioner Franklin seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.

- C. Retired Educator's Day Proclamation Chairman Macomson read the proclamation aloud to honor Retired Educator's Day, Sunday November 7<sup>th</sup>.

  Commissioner Franklin made a motion to approve the proclamation and authorize the chairman to sign. Commissioner Swails seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.
- D. ACCG Defined Contribution Plan Amendment/Restatement Commissioner Swails motioned to approve the updates to stay in compliance with updated laws and authorize the chairman to sign off. Commissioner Foster seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.
- E. Neal Rd Update Director DeLozier briefed the board that he had spoken to Banks County Commissioner Sammy Reese who expressed that he spoke to three other members of the board and Banks County had no issues with the proposed rezone. He stated he also spoke to Jason Dykes and his boss Shane Jones of Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) who relayed that they would possibly have to widen the entrance to Neal Road if the application was approved, but cannot give any further





guidance until after the rezoning has been approved and future impacts are seen.

Commissioner Wester asked about the Banks and Franklin County Line. Director DeLozier presented the board with a copy of the certified plat that has been on file at the courthouse with the Franklin County Clerk of Superior Court. He stated this was the legal record of this property demonstrating that it lies within the boundary of Franklin County.

Commissioner Franklin asked about the right-of-way for the Department of Transportation. Director DeLozier stated he did not know the right-of-way for Highway 59, but that there were markers for I-85 on the plat indicating 100 feet right-of-way monument which was found by the surveyor completing the plat.


Commissioner Foster motioned to take the Troy Construction LLC rezoning application off of the table and resume consideration. Commissioner Swails seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.

Director DeLozier re-summarized the application. Troy LLC is a utility pipeline construction entity that plans to use the property to store equipment. The planning and zoning board unanimously recommended approval of the Troy Construction LLC rezoning application with the condition that the Franklin County Road Superintendent check the condition of the road, and review the ingress and egress, and this condition had already been fulfilled at the time of this meeting. The Franklin County Road Superintendent found the road sufficient at the time of inspection and recommended allowing Franklin County to continue maintaining the road.

Commissioner Wester asked about contacting DOT if the application was approved. Director DeLozier said if approved, he would have to reach back out to Shane Jones of GDOT for further action on their part.

Chairman Macomson noted for the record that copies of the application, plat, petition, and all other supplemental public documents were present and available for inspection.

Chairman Macomson called for a motion.





Commissioner Swails motioned to approve Troy LLC's application to rezone. Commissioner Foster seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-1 with Commissioner Franklin voting in opposition.

- F. LMIG 2022 Project List Manager Turner reviewed the LMIG list as it was previously presented at the Work Session. Commissioner Wester motioned to approve the proposal. Commissioner Foster seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.
- G. Service Delivery Strategy Commissioner Foster made a motion to approve and authorize the chairman to sign off on the SDS packet to return to the Dept. of Community Affairs (DCA). Commissioner Franklin seconded the motion. No further discussion. All were in favor, 4-0.

### **Item 9: Announcements:**

Manager Turner reminded everyone of the Fall Retreat for the Board of Commissioners being held on Wednesday, November 3, 2021, beginning at 12:00 pm at the Carnesville Community Center. This is a strategic planning retreat and department heads and constitutional officers will attend.

He also reminded everyone of the Hometown Heroes Event being held on November 13, 2021, beginning with a dedication event for the Veterans Memorial Plaza at 9:00 am. The county needs additional volunteers, and those wishing to help should contact the county clerk. This is a community development event and admission is free to the public. Food vendors will be present, and there will be fireworks in the evening.

Chairman Macomson thanked those who came out to the meetings tonight. He noted that at this meeting, the Board of Commissioners resumed in-person meetings after two months of virtual meetings due to the coronavirus pandemic. Safety of citizens has been foremost in making decisions about how and where to conduct meetings. He encouraged everyone who hasn't already early-voted to vote in tomorrow's election. There are important city races and there are also four county referenda on the sale of alcohol in the unincorporated areas of Franklin County. The referenda give citizens a chance to weigh in on this issue and have their voices heard.
