
## Do I need a NPDES Construction Stormwater Permit (NOI) from EPD for my Land Disturbing Activities?



1. "Secondary Permittee" means an owner, individual builder, utility company, or utility contractor that conducts a construction activity within a common development with an existing primary permittee.

2. "Tertiary Permittee" means either the Owner or Operator of a remaining lot(s) within a common development (as defined in this permit) conducting a construction activity where the primary permittee and all secondary permittees have submitted a Notice of Termination (NOT) in accordance with Part VI.A.2. of this permit (excluding utility companies and/or utility contractors working under a Blanket NOI) or where a primary permittee does not exist. Tertiary permittees are eligible to apply for coverage 90 days after primary permittee has submitted and been approved for termination of coverage. Tertiary permittees must have an ES&PC Plan, install BMPs per the Plan, have inspections conducted by a GSWCC certified inspector, and monitor rainfall until permit coverage is terminated.
